Romance scams are the highest-earning form of social engineering fraud, costing victims billions every year worldwide. 1. The Anatomy of a Romance Scam

Romance scams follow a predictable structure. Understanding each stage helps platforms detect them algorithmically and helps individuals recognize them before it is too late.

1.1. Building the Fake Persona

Scammers create profiles using stolen photographs of real individuals, typically sourced from publicly available social media content. In many cases, the real individuals are completely unaware that their identity is being used in fraudulent activity.

With the rapid advancement of artificial intelligence, this threat has evolved significantly. Attackers are no longer limited to stolen images. They can now generate entirely synthetic personas using AI, including hyper realistic profile photos, videos, and even voice interactions. These AI generated identities can appear fully authentic, with consistent backstories, facial expressions, and behavioral patterns that closely mimic real human users.

As a result, traditional detection methods that rely on identifying reused or stolen images are becoming insufficient. Platforms must now contend with identities that are not only fake, but also uniquely generated and highly convincing, making trust based interactions significantly more vulnerable to exploitation.

IDENTITY THEFT WITHIN A SCAM

Romance scams often involve two victims: the person being defrauded, and the real individual whose identity was stolen. WeVerify's KYC tools protect both, by ensuring verified identity is attached to platform accounts.

1.2. Establishing the Relationship

The scammer invests heavily in relationship building. They move quickly from an initial platform to private messaging. They express deep feelings early and create an intense, exclusive bond. They call, send voice notes, and use realistic AI-generated video or audio to appear convincing. They are consistent, attentive, and seemingly devoted.

1.3. Introducing the Financial Request

The first financial request is always framed as a reluctant, embarrassing necessity. A medical emergency. A business deal that requires temporary bridging capital. A customs fee on a gift they tried to send. The amount starts small and grows. Each successful request confirms to the scammer that the victim can be pushed further.

1.4. Escalation and Abandonment

Over time, the requests escalates in urgency and size. When the victim eventually refuses or runs out of money, contact becomes sparse, then stops entirely. The scammer moves on to the next target. The victim is left with financial loss, emotional devastation, and often the confusion of not fully understanding what happened to them.

2. Psychological Mechanics: Why Smart People Fall for It

One of the most important things to understand about romance scams is that they are not a reflection of the victim's intelligence. They are a reflection of how effectively scammers exploit universal psychological principles.

Psychological Principle	How Scammers Exploit It
Reciprocity	Giving attention and care creates obligation to respond in kind
Scarcity and urgency	Limited-time crises override deliberate thinking
Authority	Professions like military or doctor create unquestioned trust
Social proof	Fake friends or testimonials validate the scammer's identity
Commitment consistency	Once invested emotionally, victims defend their choice
Isolation	Scammers encourage secrecy, cutting off trusted voices

3. Platform Liability and Regulatory Exposure

Platforms that knowingly or negligently allow romance scammers to operate face growing regulatory and legal risk. In the EU, the Digital Services Act (DSA) requires platforms to take systemic action against illegal content and harmful activities, including fraud. In the UK, the Online Safety Act places specific duties of care on platforms to protect users.

Beyond regulation, there is significant reputational and financial exposure. Class action lawsuits against major platforms for failure to protect users from fraud are increasing. Proactive investment in identity verification and fraud detection is no longer optional for any platform that facilitates social interaction or financial transactions.

COMPLIANCE INSIGHT

Under the EU's AML framework and the forthcoming AML Authority (AMLA) regulations, platforms with exposure to financial flows connected to romance fraud may face direct supervisory obligations. Early compliance investments now prevent far larger costs later.
